About New Midland Group:

New Midland Group (NMG) is a consortium of three artist-led organisations located in Nottingham: Backlit, One Thoresby Street and Primary. All three support the creative development of artists in the City and the wider region, providing space for the production and display of art. Building on the legacy of The Midland Group formed in 1943, we work together to develop the profile and sustainability of contemporary visual arts in the Midlands, through research, activity, and opportunities that are additional to the three organisations' work.

New Midland Group City Pilot Programme:

NMG will deliver an 18-month pilot project intended to support both established contemporary artists and those interested in the arts in Nottingham and across the Midlands, with a focus on interdisciplinary research and redefining collaborative practice. The programme will develop over the course of the project, centring around a group of core participants who will be offered a slate of activity including mentoring, collaboration and professional development. The project also includes a public programme of free public discussions, workshops and events, plus bursary opportunities open to practitioners based in the Midlands.

New Midland Group City Pilot Programme has an emphasis on collaboration, understanding artistic research and building confidence, as well as sustainability, both artistic and environmental.

NMG is looking for a Midlands based website designer to redevelop / create a new structure for the consortium's <u>website</u> which will play a central role in increasing the reach of NMG, and the project ahead of its launch. **The website will...**

- Increase NMG's visibility and develop its public profile across the Midlands, nationally and internationally as a platform for excellence in artist development.
- o Promote opportunities delivered through the NMG City Pilot Programme.
- o Be simple to update with regular content, news and visuals.
- Be shaped by NMG City Pilot Programme associates. Associates will work with the Programme Coordinator, who will update the site following its redevelopment.
- o Align with and support NMG's social media output and an expanding mailing list.
- Be reviewed as part of a wider consortium consultation process and by <u>Near Now</u> who will provide digital consultation.
